Dear Friends,

We are grateful to have you join us from home this evening as we celebrate SOME's 50 years of serving adults, children, and families in our community who are vulnerable and in need. We are heartened to be united and knitted together in our commitment to meet the urgent and basic needs of our most vulnerable neighbors. You have inspired and blessed us with your willingness to join us in fighting homelessness and poverty, two transcendent problems that have continued to vex us during the half century of SOME's existence. Although we have not entirely beaten these twin nemeses, we are winning battles, one person, one family, and one community at a time. Your support – your time, treasure and talent are helping us transform lives in meaningful, powerful, and lasting ways.

These are challenging times for sure, especially in view of the multiple public health and social crisis confronting communities across the Nation, including here in our Nation's capital. However, at SOME, we are agile, energized, and as determined as ever to provide the array of critical services that address the urgent needs of people who seek our help, from emergency services like food, clothing, bathrooms, and showers, to service-enriched affordable housing, to healthcare (including medical, dental, behavioral, and addiction treatment), and finally to academic enrichment and job training.

In the face of COVID-19, we have been moved by the tremendous support we have received over the last several months. This support has been critical to our being able to adapt and transform ourselves so that we can both increase the scale of what we do and services we provide, but also effectively adjust how we deliver these services safely during a pandemic. For many people we serve, the difficulty of just “getting by” every day has amplified, but so too have our efforts to make sure that they do get by, that they find ways to sustain themselves and their families, and begin the journey to prosperity – material, emotional, and, indeed, spiritual – even in the midst of a pandemic.

Tonight is a time to reflect and celebrate what we have done and the people we have served during SOME's first 50 years; but perhaps more importantly, we are able to look forward and commit ourselves to doing even more in the next 50 years, exceeding the high bar we already have set for ourselves. The demand for housing and essential human services continues to grow here in the District. Thanks to you and other SOME stakeholders, we are confident that we will go a long way towards meeting this need.

We also celebrate and give thanks for Father John Adams, President Emeritus of SOME. We recognize Father John as one of our foundational leaders, and a great humanitarian whose relentless commitment, inspiration, and skill has built and grown an organization that moves people in need (our sisters and brothers) from insufficiency to sufficiency, and for many, eventual prosperity.

Chairing our Gala requires an enormous commitment to SOME, a legion of volunteers, and exceptionally strong volunteer leadership. We are blessed to have such leaders in our Dinner Chair Tom Donohue, and our Silent Auction Chair Suzanne Clark, along with SOME's entire Corporate Advisory Board.

Our Fund-A-Need tonight will support a complete overhaul of SOME's Dining Room which, over the past 42 years, has served over 14 million meals to those in need. Thank you for your continued support!



In 1978, Father Horace McKenna, founder of SOME, invited Father John to become the Director of SOME. Under his leadership, SOME grew from a small soup kitchen with one employee and two volunteers to an organization that provides more than 1,200 daily meals and more to those experiencing homelessness and extreme poverty in the city.

Father John has often been recognized for his work at SOME, as Washingtonian of the Year, a Freedom Forum Free Spirit, an Olympic Torch Carrier, a Congressional Victory Against Hunger Award recipient, and recipient of an Honorary Doctorate from Marymount University. Tonight, we are honored to recognize Father John as the Father Horace McKenna Humanitarian of the Year for his tireless dedication and tenacity in carrying on the vision of Father McKenna and the other founders of SOME.

Through countless challenges and obstacles, Father John worked to expand SOME's mission. Step by step, programs were added with the ultimate result of providing a comprehensive continuum of care—always with a focus of treating each person with dignity and respect—that has led to the empowerment and transformation of so many lives.

Father John has inspired countless staff members, volunteers, and donors over the years to be part of SOME's mission. Their involvement and personal transformation has created a rippling effect, creating voices of advocacy for those experiencing poverty and homelessness. Early this year, Father John stepped into his new role as President Emeritus after 42 years of dedicated service as SOME's leader.

We are pleased to have this opportunity to recognize Father John for his lifelong commitment to improving the lives of the most vulnerable in our community.
